THE RINGWOOD SCHOOL UNIFORM FROM SEPTEMBER 2020

Take pride in your appearance

Uniform is a statement of pride in the school, a statement of belonging and a personal commitment by the individual to the school. Our school uniform is designed to present a positive image of our school to both our local and wider community. Parents are asked to purchase items from the recommended school suppliers.

The school uniform must be worn at the following times:

- Coming to school and going home from school.
- During lessons.
- All students must ensure that uniform is correct and smart when leaving registration periods and between all lessons.

The jumper can be worn under the blazer but not in place of a blazer.</p> <p>Grey Ringwood School Trousers, supplied by Stevensons to match the school blazer. These trousers are available in different fittings to better suit each child.</p> <p>Socks Black socks or grey plain socks are to be worn with trousers.</p>	<p>Tie - The School Tie - This should be worn in a traditional way, with top shirt button fastened. It should be long enough to reach the belly button.</p> <p>Jumper - Bottle Green Ringwood School "V" necked jumper with the grey piping. Not compulsory. The jumper can be worn under the blazer but not in place of a blazer.</p> <p>The Ringwood School Green Tartan Skirt - Skirts should be knee length and must not be rolled up.</p> <p>Socks / Tights - White, black or grey socks or black, grey or neutral tights. Students should wear socks or tights not both. Tights should not have any type of pattern on them.</p>

SCHOOL UNIFORM - EXPECTATIONS

The following expectations apply for both uniforms:

Outdoor coats - No "hoodies", denim style, combat-style, tracksuit top or motorbike style leather jackets will be permitted in school. The coat should be multi-purpose.

Shoes - shoes should be black, with a closed toe, flat, leather and sensible.

The following shoes are not part of our school uniform - canvas shoes, boots, trainers (or trainer styles), sports shoes, plimsolls, any fabric that is not leather, shoes with any visible branding or logos, Uggs, sandals, mules, flip-flops, stiletto heels or court shoes. Training shoes are only to be worn for PE and not as part of normal school dress. Training shoes are not to be worn to and from school.

Hair - Hair should be traditionally styled. Extremes of fashion e.g. shaved hair, beads, fabric wraps, unnatural tints, dyes and highlights are not acceptable in school.

Jewellery - Piercings - one stud or sleeper (in silver or gold) may be worn in each ear. NO OTHER visible body piercings are allowed e.g. nose studs, eyebrow rings, and tongue studs. Other forms of body piercing, (including plastic retainers of any kind), tongue studs, tattoos and ear stretchers are not permitted. A small religious symbol and chain may be worn but it should not be visible.

No other forms of jewellery will be allowed because of problems of loss or safety. All jewellery must be removed for P.E. on Health and Safety grounds. The school cannot be responsible for lost jewellery and badges.

Badges - only school issued badges may be worn on the lapel of the blazer.

Make-up - May be worn if it is discreet. If it can be seen it is not discreet. Eye make-up, lipstick and nail varnish should not be worn.

False eyelashes and acrylic nails are also not permitted, and students will be asked to remove them.
