This week's revision strategy: Active Revision



Read, Cover, Repeat and Check

Read a page and highlight the most important information. Cover it up. Write down or say the highlighted information that you can remember. Check what you missed out. Do it again until you can remember it all.



Hide & Seek

Write information about the topic on 12 pieces of paper. Place them on the table with the information face down. Look at a card, try to say what is written on it, turn it over to see if you are right. If you are, leave it turned up. If not leave it face down & you return to it once you have done all the other cards.




Read and Explain

Read through some of your notes. Then give them to your parents and try to explain them to them. Because they will not know the subject, they will ask you questions about it until you have explained it clearly.

Post-It

Write key information onto post-it notes and stick them where you will see them every day – on the back of the toilet door, next to the mirror, on the stairs. Change the post-it notes every 3 days. Every day walk the trail of post-it notes, and as you approach each one say what you can remember is on it. Then check you got it right.



Key Word Game Find all the key words from a unit of work. Write them on small pieces of paper. Play "Articulate" with some friends by describing the words so they can guess what the word is. Who guessed the most? Look up any you cannot do.





Snowball

Work with 3-4 friends.
Choose a topic. Take
turns to explain one thing
about the topic. You are
knocked out when you
have run out of things to
explain. Repeat it, but
this time you must repeat
what someone else said
the first time.



Familiar Links Remember key information by associating it with familiar things you see every day. E.g., see the walk to school as a timeline and the key landmarks on the walk as the key events from the timeline.
